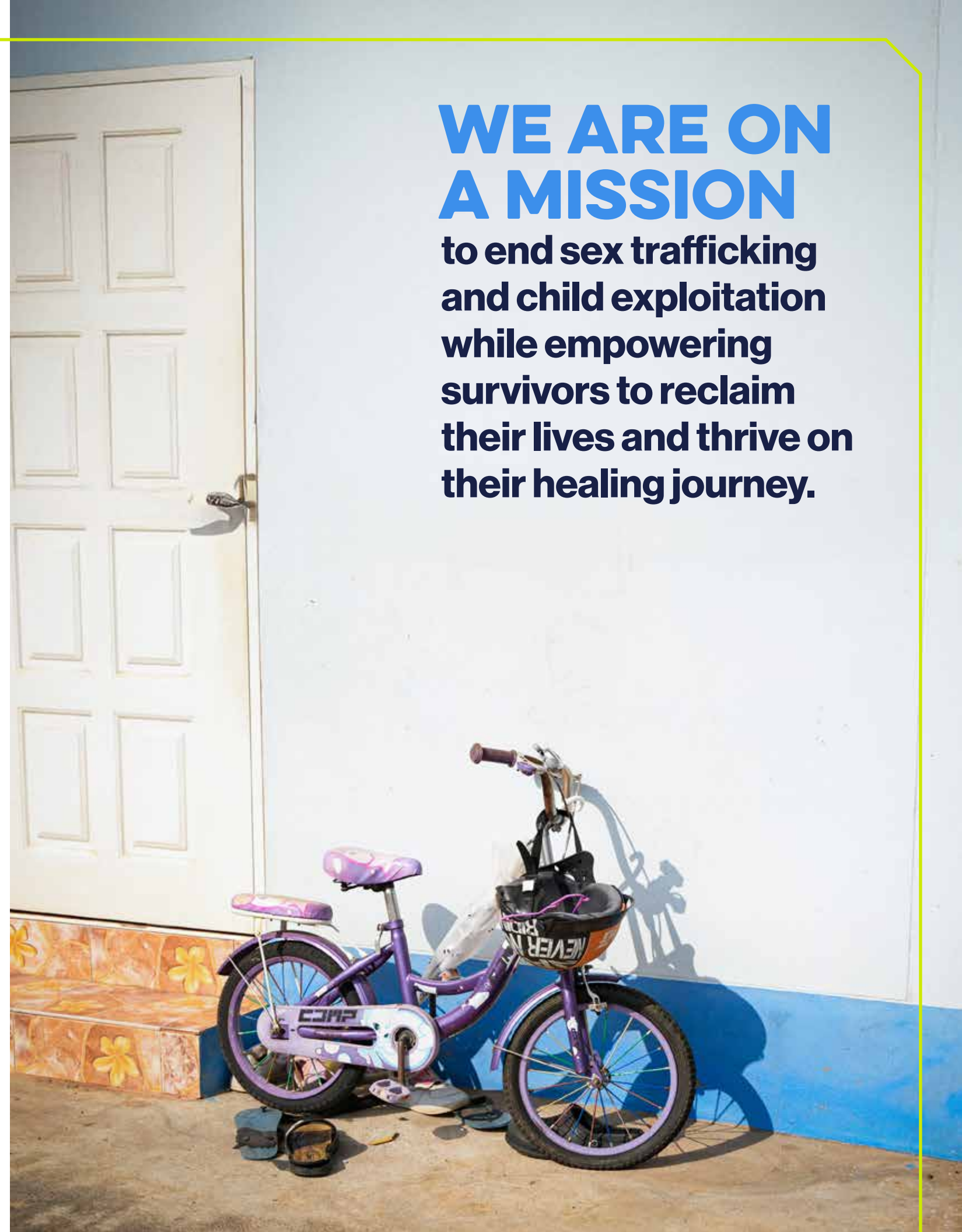

DEAR FRIEND,

My journey in law enforcement began in 1993 with the U.S. Customs Service along the Southwest border of the United States, where I served in some of the most challenging environments in the country. I eventually led Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) in San Diego and, later, the entire agency.

My career experiences revealed an unwavering truth I bring into my new role at Our Rescue—the most effective fight against human trafficking and exploitation are waged alongside nonprofits, advocates, and communities. My vision for Our Rescue in 2025 includes forging deeper partnerships with more nonprofit organizations. As I often say: 100 of us can do 100 small things, but if 100 of us come together to do one big thing, we can do more together.

While Our Rescue has always had a global focus, one of my top priorities as CEO is deepening our impact here at home. In the U.S., we want to support all 62 Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) task forces, which are coalitions made up of local, state, and federal entities. In 2025, we aim to provide technology, tools, training, and survivor care in places where officers and investigators are doing more with less.

In 2024, we made bold investments in technology and innovation that focus on the safety of our communities and protection of our children. Here's what our donor support made possible in 2024:

- Operations in 27 countries and all 50 U.S. states
- 195 rescue missions
- 1,052 survivors supported
- 1,969 arrests assisted
- 24 Electronic Storage Detection (ESD) K9s deployed

Last year, we also took a hard look inward reducing operational spend to prioritize our mission. Because we owe it to those we serve to remain lean, effective, and focused. I'm proud to report that 2024 was one of Our Rescue's most successful fundraising years on record, empowering our mission and amplifying our impact.

Looking ahead to 2025, we will continue to enhance ICAC support, invest deeper in U.S. communities, and work with our trusted partners to ensure every survivor knows they are not alone. Because when we fight together, Our Rescue lives up to its name. This work isn't ours alone. It belongs to all of us, as a shared responsibility and movement.

Since joining Our Rescue as CEO in 2025, I've found a new badge to proudly wear. It no longer says "special agent" but still carries a mission deeply connected to my career of service: protecting society's most vulnerable and pursuing justice.

ASIA

Operation Pakkapao

In Thailand, a woman was sexually exploiting two teenage girls at the karaoke bar she owned, according to police. After authorities contacted Our Rescue for assistance, we conducted field observations and reported findings to support the police investigation.

It was discovered that the bar owner was exploiting a 15-year-old girl through sex trafficking to make a profit, charging roughly \$68.44 to each customer. Police organized a rescue operation on the evening of Tuesday, May 7. Our Rescue was present to assist with the six-hour operation where authorities arrested the bar owner and rescued the 15-year-old and discovered another minor on scene. Officials say she too was exploited by the bar owner. Both are now receiving government care.

LATIN AMERICA

Operation Chameleon

On July 10, in partnership with teams from Our Rescue and U.S. law enforcement, Ecuadorian authorities successfully apprehended a well-known pediatrician on charges of both the production and distribution of child sexual abuse material (CSAM) to online sites around the world, including to the United States. The 63-year-old pediatrician, Pablo Aníbal I.P., had been under investigation since March of 2024, after police received a tip that he was creating CSAM of his patients, ranging in age from 8-12 years old.

Operation Amazon

In the Amazon rainforest, a father and two uncles were sexually abusing six children. The Ecuadorian National Police requested assistance, and Our Rescue agreed to provide financial support along with Field Operations and Survivor Care personnel to help. The operation required many hours of intense travel. The teams traveled via cars, motorized canoe, and on foot through the rainforest. The children were found and were escorted out of harm under local authorities’ protection. Our Rescue provided Survivor Care to the survivors as well and continued to coordinate their care with in-country officials.



Field Operations



Operation Monrovia

In Africa, a man lured two 14-year-old girls away from their homes and forced them into commercial sex work. The minors believed they would have jobs as maids but were forced to work at a bar and were sexually exploited instead, according to officials.

Our Rescue provided support to the local authorities working on the case. This key assistance helped them rescue both girls and arrest the man during Operation Monrovia. The survivors have now been reunited with their mothers, and the suspected predator is behind bars.

Operation Ghana

In November of 2024, Our Rescue collaborated with the Anti-Human Trafficking Unit of the Ghana Police Service to rescue children that had been trafficked from Nigeria into Ghana and then forced into illicit cyber activities. Acting swiftly, the Ghana Police Service sought the support of Our Rescue to overcome resource constraints and execute the rescue mission. Nineteen survivors were rescued and the suspect responsible for their exploitation was arrested. The survivors—eight of whom were minors—received medical care supported by Our Rescue. In partnership with the National Agency for the Prohibition of Trafficking in Persons (NAPTIP) in Nigeria, Our Rescue helped coordinate the repatriation of 18 survivors to their home country.



Operation Paturko

In Northern Spain, a criminal group forced 13 women into commercial sex work, keeping them available 24 hours a day. The victims endured threats, humiliation, poor living conditions, and severe restrictions on their movement. Our Rescue supported the Spanish National Police by donating technical equipment that helped advance the investigation. We were also present during coordinated operations across six locations, which led to the rescue of the women and the arrest of eight suspected traffickers. Authorities dismantled the syndicate and seized cash, illegal drugs, jewelry, and vehicles, while also ensuring support for the survivors.

Operation Prior

In October, Our Rescue joined a multi-agency effort with the Spanish Policia Nacional (SNP), the Policía Nacional de Colombia, INTERPOL, and the Spanish Guardia Civil. Our Rescue was on the ground during the SNP-led operation in Spain, where multiple warrants were executed, resulting in the arrest of 18 traffickers and rescue of 18 survivors from sexual exploitation.

The traffickers recruited women from impoverished regions of Colombia, luring them with false promises of a better life. Upon arrival in Spain, their passports were taken, and they were sent to clubs where they were coerced into commercial sexual exploitation.

At the request of SNP and INTERPOL, Our Rescue provided logistical support and worked with a Spain-based NGO to assist survivors—offering emergency transportation, lodging, and other immediate needs.



UNITED STATES AND CANADA

Operation Coast to Coast

In August, Our Rescue supported the coordinated efforts of law enforcement and aligned partners across the 12 U.S. states in an operation organized to assist survivors of human trafficking and arrest their traffickers. During the operation, 94 adults and 2 minors were contacted and offered needed survivor care services, and 39 suspected perpetrators were identified or detained during dozens of operations conducted by police nationwide.

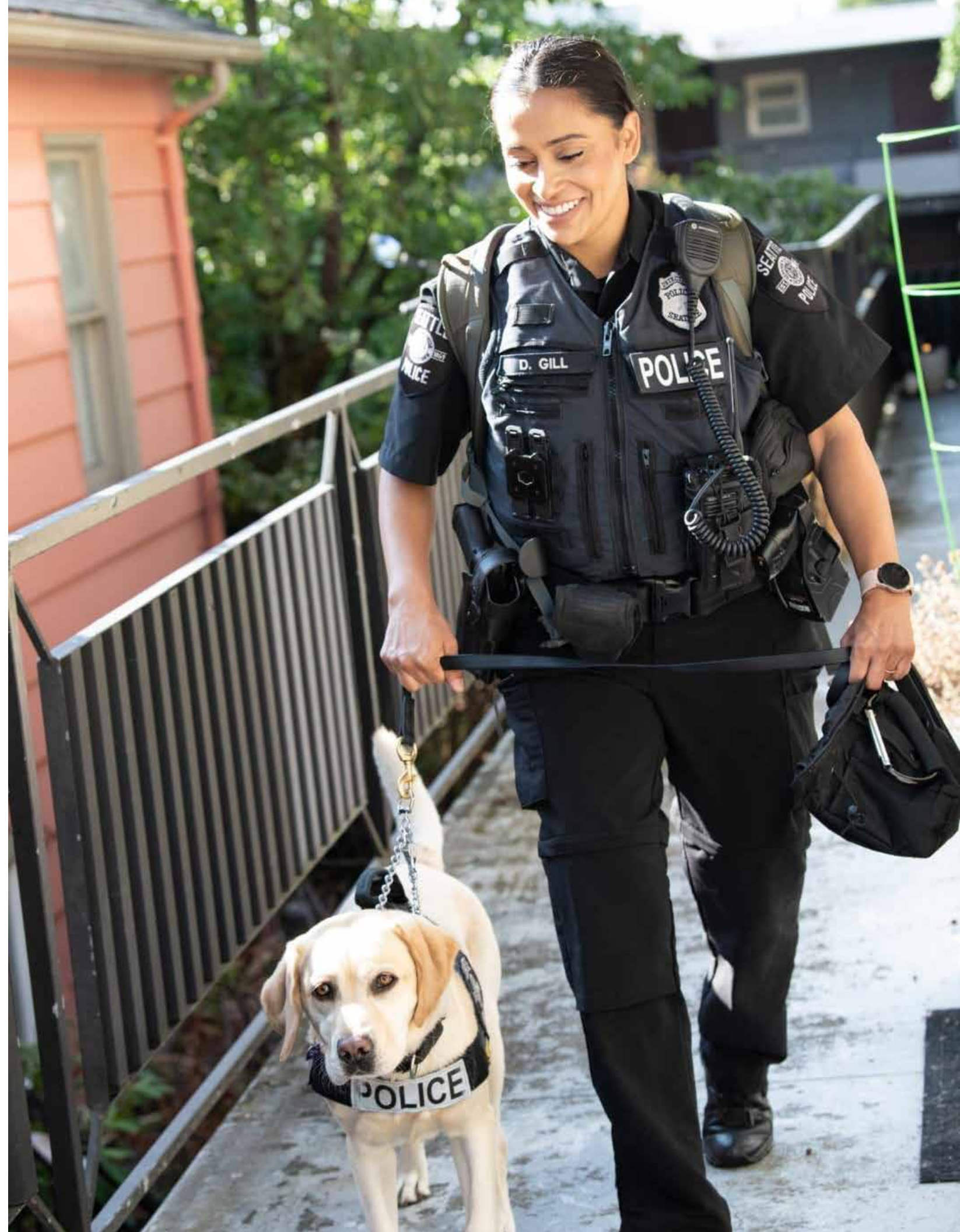


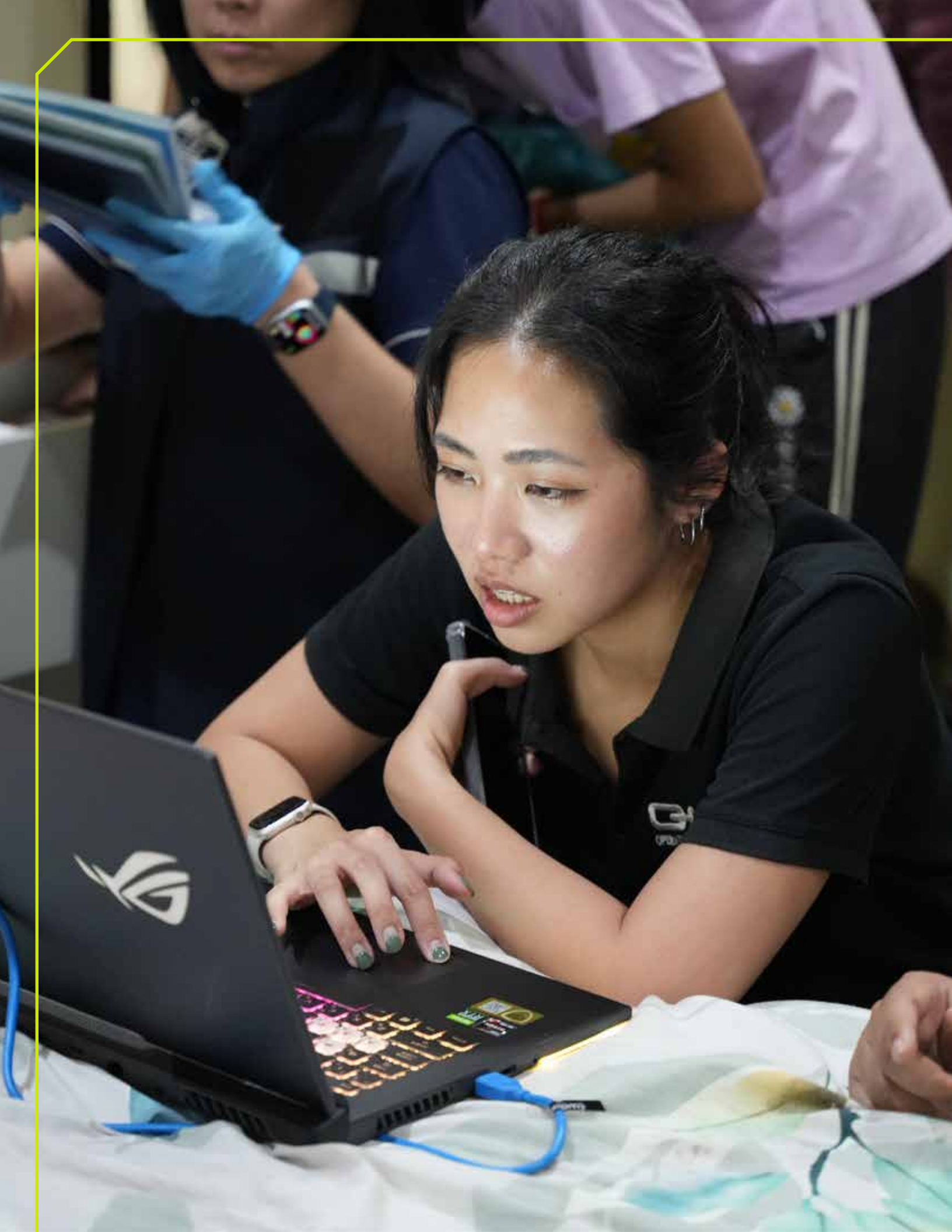

Operation Home Alone

A reverend and 14 other men were arrested in Texas for using the internet to target minors for sexual purposes. Charges filed include online solicitation of a minor and soliciting prostitution of a person under 18 years of age. This three-day operation was led by the Collin County Sheriff's Office, with multiple agencies in the state stepping in to support.

Our Rescue provided resources to law enforcement. In addition to the arrests, investigators seized 13.9 grams of suspected methamphetamine, two firearms, and several electronic devices to be examined.





DIGITAL FORENSICS

We support our global law enforcement partners by assessing their investigative and forensic needs, implementing advanced, technical training, providing case mentoring, and expanding their forensic capabilities with specialized computers and Artificial Intelligence (AI) enabled forensic software to help in the fight against sex trafficking and child exploitation.

Forensics Support

In Wisconsin, a minor was being sexually assaulted by her 20-year-old brother. The girl reported the assault to her school resource officer and the Eau Claire County Sheriff's Office opened an investigation. Police utilized digital forensic software funded by Our Rescue to collect evidence from both the survivor's phone and the suspect's phone. An examination of the data showed text messages and photos that confirmed the minor's claims of sexual abuse. Her brother was arrested on sexual assault and incest charges, and the survivor was provided with services to assist with her healing.

Op Home Alone

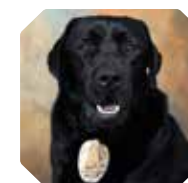
ESD K9 PROGRAM

The Our Rescue Electronic Storage Detection (ESD) K9 Program supports law enforcement in locating hidden evidence of child exploitation. These specially trained “dog detectives” can detect electronic storage devices—like phones, USBs, and SD cards—often concealed by perpetrators to hide child sexual abuse material (CSAM). By deploying K9s alongside investigators during search warrants, Our Rescue enhances the precision and success of operations, ensuring more victims are protected and more offenders are prosecuted.



K9 Welles Success

An Iowa man, Jeffrey Gray, was allegedly secretly recording dozens of minors at his home studio with cameras placed in smoke detectors and dressing rooms from approximately 2005 to 2016. Our Rescue-sponsored Electronic Storage Detection (ESD) K9 Welles located a hard drive containing child sexual abuse material (CSAM) during a police search of Gray’s home. Welles’ finding helped police to arrest and charge the 61-year-old man for producing and possessing CSAM. The FBI identified 15 individuals that were exploited by the photographer.



K9 Jib Success

Nicholas Morgan-Derosier was in possession of more than 6,000 files of child sexual abuse material (CSAM), and authorities found chat history where he talked about sexually abusing multiple young family members. Jib, an ESD K9 funded by Our Rescue, helped law enforcement find a tablet during a secondary search at the man’s home. Authorities used it to find a password that broke the encryption to Morgan-Derosier’s phone, which led to the finding of CSAM and his arrest. On May 30, the man was sentenced to 40 years in prison.

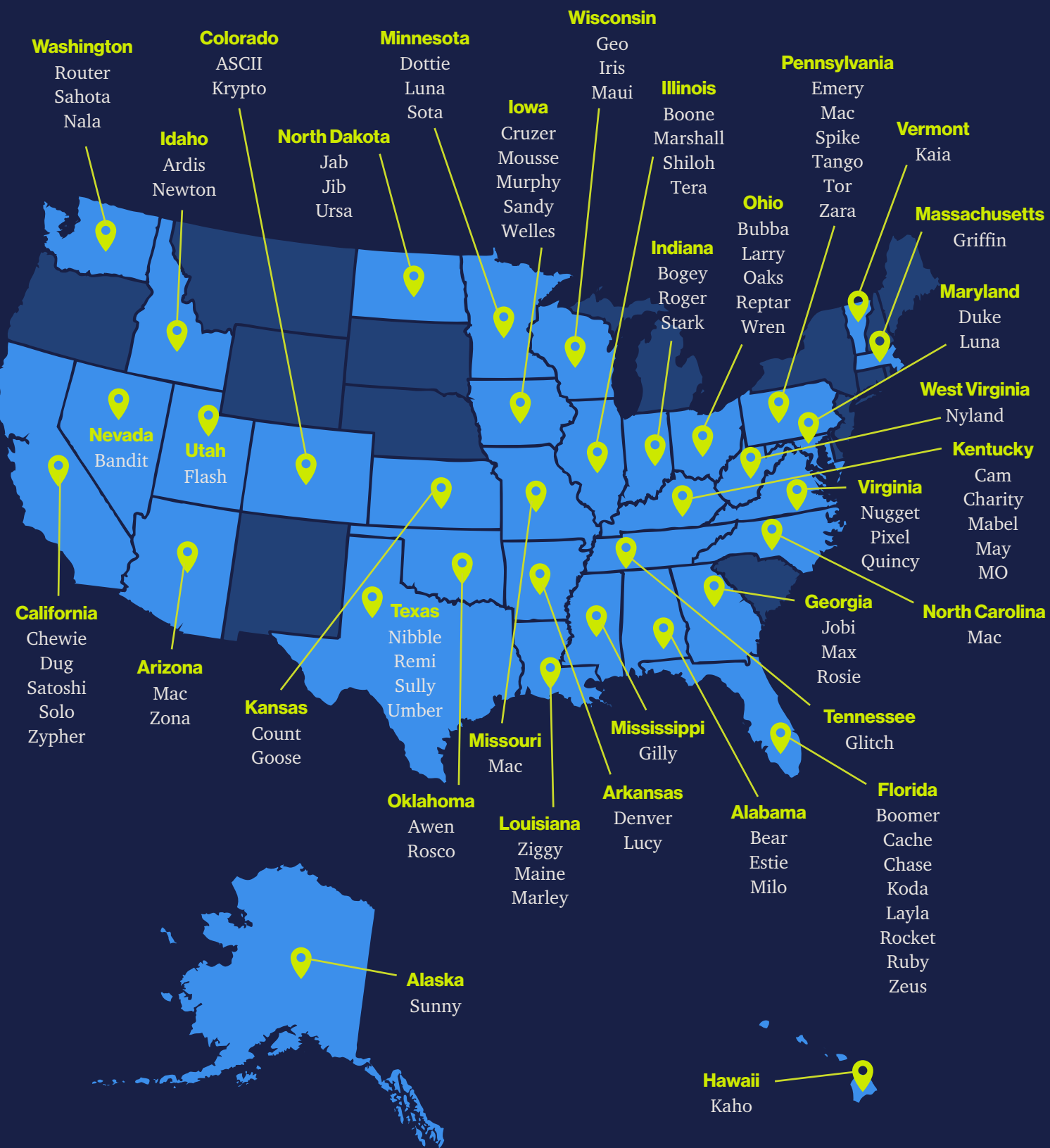

SURVIVOR CARE

At Our Rescue, we take a survivor-centered, culturally sensitive, and trauma-informed approach to our work. We prioritize survivor's safety and protection through collaboration and holistic care. In 2024 alone, we supported: 1,052 Survivors, 71 Survivor Care Homes, 123 Non-Government Organizations

Ghana

Africa/Middle East

Our Rescue supported 100 survivors in 2024. We worked closely with government agencies for roughly 30 survivors to be placed in a partner shelter. Each partner shelter that had referrals from us received supplies for the care of the survivors. The supplies ranged from food (bags of rice, oil, sugar, groceries, and confectionaries).

This support was provided to five partner shelters namely: Amazing Shepherd, Power of Love, Ark Foundation, Kiku Shelter, Missionaries of Charity. These shelters would not have received any support from the referral agency, if Our Rescue was not involved. Further, we signed an MoU with the Department of Social Welfare to support two children with cerebral palsy who are residence in a center for disability named Happy Academy and Assessment Center. Through the MoU, Our Rescue has committed to support these children till the reach the age of majority. Through Our Rescue’s intervention, the police rescued the children from a home which subjected the children to child sexual abuse and produced child sexual abuse material (CSAM) of the children. The center receives funding from Our Rescue every quarter.



Jordan

Africa/Middle East

In 2024, Our Rescue continued its partnership with Jordan’s main government shelter for trafficking survivors, which now includes a section for female juvenile beggars. We hosted a vocational workshop for 15 female survivors—13 African, 1 Jordanian, and 1 Bangladeshi—and delivered specialized training to shelter staff on trauma-informed care and survivor support. The shelter’s clinic was also equipped with essential medical supplies, and a collaborative garden rehabilitation project was launched with the Ministry of Social Development to improve outdoor space for residents.

Beyond this shelter, Our Rescue supported Dar Al-Hanan—a center for female juveniles who have experienced sexual abuse, family disconnection, or homelessness—by providing medical equipment and kitchen appliances, with rehabilitation workshops underway. We also responded to a new shelter’s request for training on sexual exploitation linked to drug abuse and began coordinating rehabilitation programs for female inmates. In total, Our Rescue has supported 106 female survivors in Jordan this year—90% of whom are African—highlighting the need for culturally and linguistically sensitive care.

Malaysia

Asia

Our Rescue supported a local NGO shelter that has, for decades, assisted migrant workers, refugees, and survivors of exploitation. Through direct aid, legal support, policy advocacy, and community interventions, the shelter provides a safe haven for trafficked survivors and vulnerable individuals. It offers services such as legal case management, psychosocial support, skills training, and reintegration pathways. Our Rescue provided monthly support to purchase groceries and essential items for survivors i.e. toiletries. Through this support, a total of 81 survivors from several nationalities were directly impacted.

A local non-profit organization in Malaysia that provides shelter to survivors of human trafficking reached out to Our Rescue Malaysia for sponsorship of a skills training program for four survivors. The organization sought support in sponsoring an industrial oven so the women could bake and sell goods to earn an income. In response, Our Rescue Malaysia reached out to a local restaurant to sponsor the oven.

The shelter supervisor shared the following feedback:

“The donated oven had a transformative impact on the survivors. It provided them with the opportunity to learn baking from scratch, allowing them to assist the organization with sales while gaining valuable skills for self-sufficiency. In addition to empowering them to support themselves upon returning home, this initiative enabled the survivors to generate income during their time at the shelter.”

Thailand

Asia

The computer room project at Sri Surat Shelter is one of eight initiatives supporting government shelters. Previously, the shelter had limited and outdated computers, restricting survivors’ opportunities to practice and develop their skills. Our Rescue contributed a built-in desk, 10 computers, an air conditioner, and proper electrical wiring to improve the space.

At the shelter, survivors have completed the following three key courses:

- ✔ **Designing Product Logos and Packaging**
- ✔ **Exploring Financial Tools**
- ✔ **Financial Literacy**

These courses help survivors build essential computer skills, explore technology, and develop practical knowledge to support their reintegration with their families and future planning.

Indonesia

Asia

Our Rescue supported 42 survivors by providing shelter, accommodation, and transportation assistance. We also assisted survivors with getting access to both formal and non-formal education, ranging from elementary to senior high school, as well as various vocational training programs. Additionally, Our Rescue provided repatriation assistance—both internationally, to and from Indonesia, and domestically, from the national level to villages. Reintegration support included economic and social assistance, along with legal aid during their time at the shelter and after returning home.

Ecuador

Latin America

In September 2024, two artisanal jewelry-making workshops were held for teenage girls at a survivor care shelter in Quito, Ecuador. Led by an indigenous Saraguro artisan, the sessions taught 14 adolescents how to craft necklaces—each requiring skill, patience, and creativity. With just a \$3 investment in materials, the girls can now create necklaces to sell for \$15, providing them with a sustainable source of income and a valuable vocational skill.

To support the girls' broader development, additional trainings were also provided, including workshops on personal finance, empowerment, and resume building—equipping them for a confident transition into adulthood.



Bulgaria

Europe

In October 2024, Our Rescue joined forces with Livia Otal, founder of Foundation for Hope, to launch a mobile education center in a Roma neighborhood in Bulgaria—one of the most vulnerable regions to child exploitation.

After receiving little support from other groups, Livia worked with Our Rescue to repurpose a bus into a traveling classroom. Staffed by Roma educators, the center creates a safe space for children to learn about personal safety, grooming, and abuse prevention. The program aims to reach over 560 children, offering not just knowledge, but also stability, empowerment, and hope in a region often overlooked by formal systems.

Unbound Now

United States

Our Rescue deepened its commitment to long-term survivor healing by partnering with Unbound Now, an organization known for its trauma-informed, survivor-led advocacy. A key element of this partnership was the sponsorship of Theo, a professionally trained facility dog who provides emotional support to survivors through every step of their journey—from crisis stabilization and counseling to courtroom testimony. Theo's presence brings a sense of calm and reassurance to moments that might otherwise feel overwhelming. Through this partnership, more survivors in North Texas are receiving consistent, compassionate care that prioritizes their dignity, safety, and future.

TRAINING & PREVENTION

In 2024, we placed a focus on training and prevention, working to stop exploitation before it starts. Our efforts are global, bringing prevention resources into homes, classrooms, organizations, communities, and the hands of law enforcement. Through our trauma-informed trainings, expert-led presentations, and culturally relevant materials, we empowered people at every level to recognize the signs of trafficking and take action to protect their communities, families, and themselves. By equipping individuals, families, organizations, institutions, and communities with the right knowledge, awareness, tools, and skills, we're creating a world where every person is safe from exploitation.

As we build our Training & Prevention efforts, Our Rescue is working with other anti-trafficking organizations to advance and reform laws, policies, and regulations that make it easier to support survivors and stop perpetrators.

Navajo Conference

After accepting an invitation to attend a Victim Advocates Meeting for the Navajo Nation in Southern Utah in July and receiving an extremely warm welcome, we were invited to present at a conference sponsored by the Utah Navajo Health System in October concerning sexual assault prevention on community-led strategies for preventing human trafficking and exploitation in tribal nations. We presented to the 311 individuals in attendance. This was a huge breakthrough to have gained the trust of these incredible people, enough to have been invited back. We strengthened many great relationships and have been invited to return in the spring of 2025.

EDUCATION IS THE BEST PREVENTION.

Wyoming Meth and Substance Abuse Conference

In October, we presented at the Wyoming Meth and Substance Abuse Conference in Casper, hosted by the National Alliance for Drug Endangered Children (National DEC). We facilitated a keynote and two breakout sessions on the intersection of human trafficking and drug endangered children for the 353 attendees. We built and strengthened relationships with organizations fighting to end sex trafficking and child exploitation. Our sessions were so well attended that people were sitting on the floor. Several invitations were extended for similar trainings in other counties and states.

American Samoa

At the request of the Department of Homeland Security, we traveled to American Samoa in March to provide discipline-specific trainings on human trafficking and trauma-informed practices.

Over the course of a week, we trained 354 individuals across law enforcement, legal and government sectors, NGOs, education, social work, airlines, ports of entry, and the private sector. Trainings were presented in a discussion format to boost engagement and focused on best practices tied to American Samoa’s human trafficking laws.

As this was the first time the topic had been addressed on the island, we were welcomed with great excitement and urgency. Many strong relationships were built, and we were invited back to continue expanding the training to other industries.

Start Talking: Online Safety Training

In 2024, we launched Start Talking, an online safety training. In today’s digital world, children and teens are consistently online for learning, socializing, and entertainment. But with that connectivity comes real risks, including online grooming, sextortion, and sexual exploitation. Our training equips parents, caregivers, and educators with the tools and knowledge they need to navigate online spaces confidently and start meaningful conversations with the children in their care. Our goal is to empower families to take a proactive role in online safety, because regular conversations are one of the best ways to help keep kids safe.

In 2024, Our Rescue made the exciting decision to transition our volunteer management system to a new platform called “VOMO.” This change aligns with our donation portal, offering a streamlined approach that enhances both our volunteer program and organizational efficiency. Since the transition, we’ve welcomed 12,730 new volunteers to the platform.

This year was filled with impactful events, awareness booths, and fundraising initiatives. We hosted approximately 110 events, with 90 of them being organized and coordinated by our dedicated volunteers.

Volunteers are the heart of Our Rescue, playing a crucial role in connecting with communities worldwide. Their passion, commitment, and tireless efforts make them an invaluable extension of our team. The Students Against Trafficking program saw strong engagement with 15 active clubs and 29 student leaders in fall 2024, raising \$2,127.70 to support the mission to end sex trafficking and child exploitation.

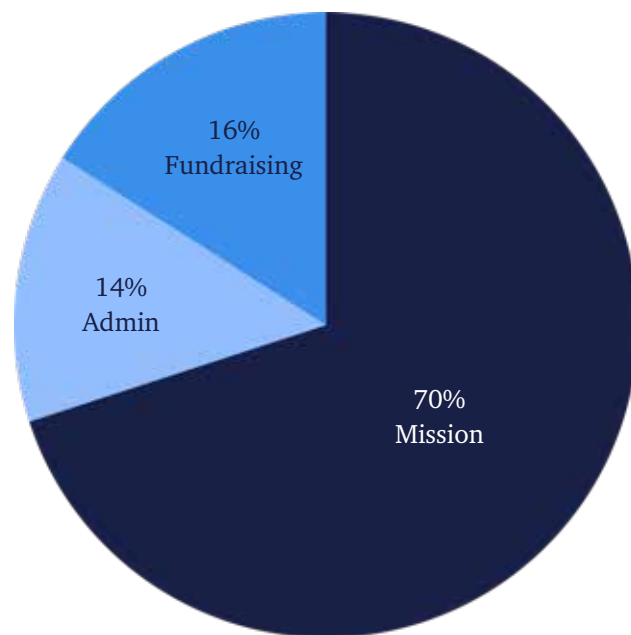

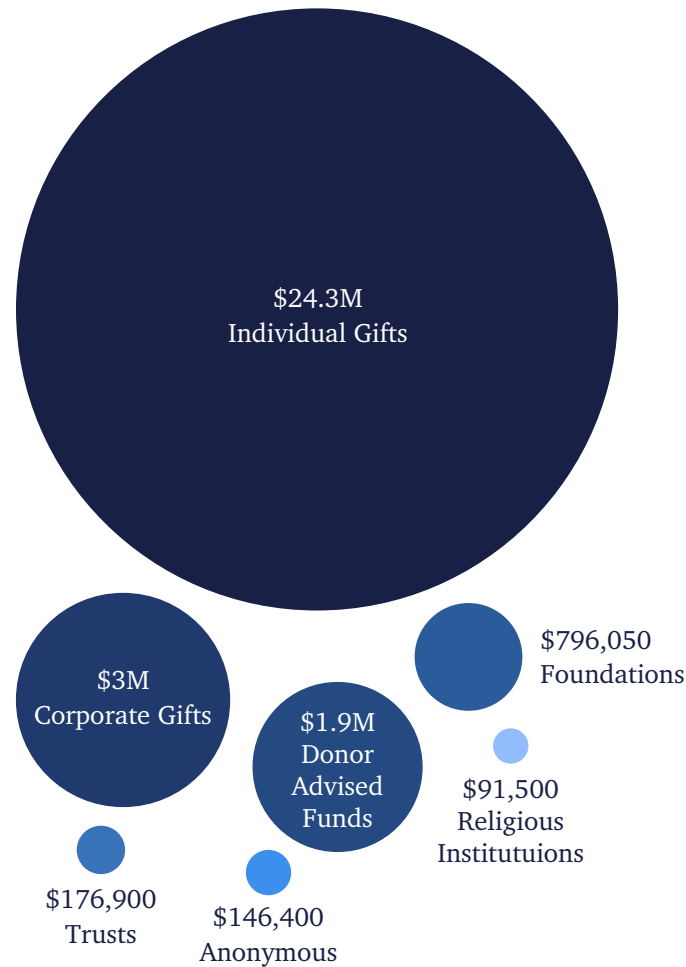

Ranch Hands Rescue receives award from Our Rescue

In 2024, the generosity of our funding partners fueled Our Rescue's relentless fight against human trafficking, securing \$490,362 in foundation funding to drive tangible impact. These funds have expanded critical programs, strengthened law enforcement partnerships, and advanced cutting-edge investigative tools, directly leading to arrests, rescues, and justice for survivors. With each grant, we are not only deepening our reach but also fortifying the infrastructure needed to dismantle exploitation at its core.

Among this year's key grantmakers, the Foxwynd Foundation awarded a \$75,000 challenge grant to fund three Electronic Storage Detection (ESD) K9s. With \$36,000 already raised toward the match, once fully funded, this grant will support the placement of six ESD K9s. Two of these dogs, K9 Router and K9 Mabel, were deployed in November 2024 and have already assisted in uncovering critical evidence and leading to five arrests within their first two months of service.

The Higher Hope Foundation awarded \$25,000 to fund an ESD K9 in Colorado, marking an important expansion in forensic investigations. As an emerging philanthropic leader committed to supporting victims of violent crime and their families, their partnership underscores the increasing recognition of advanced investigative tools as essential in trafficking cases and reflects the deepening commitment of foundations to combating human trafficking.

Beyond receiving funding, Our Rescue also assisted fellow NGOs through the 2024 Our Rescue Challenge Grant. Recognizing that we cannot fight this battle alone, we launched this initiative to uplift fellow organizations and strengthen the anti-trafficking

ecosystem as a whole. By investing in organizations working in prevention, survivor care, and advocacy, we ensure that critical services reach more communities and that together, we have a greater impact.

CAMPAIGN HIGHLIGHTS

● MYTH VS TRUTH



To mark National Human Trafficking Awareness Day, Our Rescue released Trafficking Myth vs. Truth, a compelling video that challenges widespread misconceptions about human trafficking. Supporters were encouraged to wear blue and share the video to spark important conversations and promote prevention through education.

● SEXTORTION AWARENESS

In response to the FBI's January 2024 warning on the global rise of financial sextortion, Our Rescue launched *I luv u*, an award-winning video created to raise awareness about this urgent issue. The film highlights the link between sextortion and youth suicide and equips families with tools to protect their children online and have potentially life-saving conversations. This short film won Best Short Film and Best Director at the Roman VIII Film Festival. It was nominated for Fan Favorite Film and it was an official selection at the Moonless International Film Festival.

● RISE UP 2024



Rise Up. Get Loud. 2024 was a nationwide movement to raise awareness and inspire action in the fight against human trafficking. A free concert in Utah and events at baseball stadiums in Texas and Minnesota drew thousands, while supporters across the country hosted their own events leading up to July 30. The campaign empowered communities to rise up, speak out, and educate others.

● HIDDEN AMONG US



Released on July 30, *Hidden Among Us* is a powerful short film that breaks down stereotypes of what a predator looks like. It reinforces the truth that traffickers can be anyone—regardless of gender, race, age, or background—and calls on communities to stay informed and vigilant.

● GIVE THEM HOPE

During the 2024 holiday season, Our Rescue launched the Give Them Hope campaign, a powerful initiative spotlighting those most vulnerable to human trafficking. Through a series of four short films, the campaign brought attention to the heightened risks faced by LGBTQ+ youth, minority groups, individuals experiencing housing insecurity, and those trafficked by family members. By elevating these stories, the campaign aimed to raise awareness, build empathy, and drive action to protect those most at risk.
